## Presidents Message February 2017



At the Annual General Meeting being held **Thursday**, **February 16 at 1:30 pm**, the membership will be asked to vote on the following **SPECIAL RESOLUTION** regarding the expansion of our facility:

Contingent on approval of the District of Sechelt Parking Variance Application, the SSAC Membership approves a budget of \$50,000.00 to proceed with the development of a detailed plan for the proposed building renovations. This process will produce an architectural plan, scope of work plan, initial building permits, and selection of a suitable contractor bid.

To be approved, this resolution requires a 2/3 majority of those present. It is crucial that a large portion of the membership is involved in this important decision. Please plan to attend.

### The Need for Renovations

The original location for what was then named "Branch 69 of the Seniors Citizens Association of B.C." was a small building on Mermaid St. and the membership was about 350 persons.

The membership numbers soon began to outgrow that facility. The land at 5604 Trail Ave. was purchased, and construction on the current building took place from 1986 – 1993, much of it with volunteer labor. Membership at the official opening in 1993 was 650 persons. Shortly after, the Society underwent an official name change, to "The Sechelt Seniors Activity Centre Society," incorporating as a registered B.C. charity under that name in 1999. There has been little change to the building since then, except for the addition of a storage room in 2013. Current membership has doubled, at over 1200 persons, and it has been so for 5 years. There has been a corresponding increase in demand for use of the facilities.

In response, the Board directed the Planning Committee to study the problems and make recommendations. The study came up with some surprising numbers, for both the increase in facilities use and use of the dining room.

As well as the increase in membership numbers, the number of activities offered by the Centre, and the amount of participation by



members has increased significantly. Over 500 person per week attend activities at the Centre. (This is in addition to the dining room service.)

The 2017 Activity Schedule lists 32 separate activities using 51 scheduled times in a seven day week. The greatest pressure is on the use of the auditorium. As well as the scheduled activities, this facility is used Monday to Friday as a lunch time dining room.

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It (the auditorium) is used for Special Events, such as theatre shows, dances, and fundraisers. It is also available to community renters on Saturdays and on Sunday mornings. It is estimated that the auditorium has an 85% occupancy rate, based on a 12 hour day.

The greatest increase in service demand has been in the use of the kitchen/ dining service. Over the past 5 years, there has been an increase of 35% in the number of meals served. During 2016, over 13,000 meals were served during the Mon-Friday

lunch hours, or 1300 meals/month during the 10 month opening period.

The use of the SSAC by renters is an important part of our connection to the community, and produces important revenues. While the usage has remained steady over the years, this is due to the lack of availability of the auditorium. Many would-be renters are turned away, because member led activities have preference.

With the increase in demand for services, comes the need for more administration. The office space allocated is woefully inadequate. A very limited open area space is used by 12 Board members, a Rental/ Activity Coordinator, a Bookkeeper, and a variety of Activity Coordinators. It is also used for filing and storage. There is no space for private/confidential meetings, or for concentrated work.

It became apparent that the SSAC is a victim of its own success. The choice was between



a cut back in services, or planning for an expansion in facilities. The Committee decided to explore options for expansion, especially since the senior population in Sechelt is growing, and so there is no reason to expect a decrease in the demand for services. A contingency fund has been built up over the years for building upgrades, and is currently at a very healthy \$300,000.00.

## The Renovation Plan

The committee obtained a federal government grant to assist with hiring a consultant architect, Peter Treuheit, to provide options for building expansion. Over the past year several options, ranging from the modest to the expansive, were considered. The committee decided on a modest version, encompassing a "push out" of the front of the building, by a depth of 18 ft., yielding an increase of approximately 1325 sq. ft. of floor space.

## Presidents Message - Renovations Information



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This will allow the following renovations:

- Expanded kitchen, a walk-in freezer/cooler, increased storage, preparation and service space, ability to serve to both the dining room and auditorium.
- A dedicated dining room seating 72, which can be converted into two multi-purpose rooms after meal hours.
- Increased availability of the auditorium, approx. 13 more hrs./week of activity time.
- Increased office space, including two private office/meeting rooms, office space for the Rental/Activity Coordinator, a second

open office area, and more storage/filing space.

- A new resident's lounge, opposite the previous one.
- an enlarged electrical room.

The committee recommends that this design is the "best fit" to address the current needs, it is financially attainable and is responsive to the reactions from the neighborhood. Please see the above drawings for more detail.

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## **Financing**

We anticipate that a combination of funding strategies will be used in the budget. Current best "guestimates" are that the project cost will be in the \$600,000.00 range. A portion will need to come from the SSAC contingency fund. In addition, the following strategies are being actively pursued:

Federal government funding may be available through the Infrastructure program. We have met with our MP, Pam Goldsmith-Jones, and have begun the application process. We believe we are in a strong position to achieve significant funding.

We have met with the Sunshine Coast Credit Union, and the SSAC will qualify for mortgage funds, or a Line-of-Credit, if needed.

We will look into funding from municipal and provincial governments as well as Individual and corporate donors.

Finally, we will be having fundraising projects, such as the "Treasure Chest."

## <u>Timeline</u>

The Board believes we are at a critical point in our planning at which we should obtain, essentially, approval in principle, from the membership, hence the current Special Resolution.

Preliminary discussions with the City of Sechelt Planning Department have determined that we must apply for a Parking Variance before any building permit will be issued, and this process will take 3 - 4months. We will then begin the process of detailed planning, which include more detailed drawings, building permits, a detailed budget, and final Membership approval. Construction could start in early 2018.

Renovation project brochures will be available in the lobby. We will also be holding information sessions, where you can bring your questions and we'll try to provide some answers.
