As we begin another busy Fall at the SSAC, one question is being asked: "What happened with the auditorium floor?" Yes, the floor replacement project hit a major snag. A team of volunteers worked hard to install a new plywood subfloor, but it proved inadequate for the job. When the flooring was laid over top, the 1/4" pine plywood buckled, causing ripples all up & down the new floor! Many heads conferred over the problem, the sales person, supplier & manufacturer were called in, & the consensus was that a thicker, better quality subfloor was needed, i.e. 3/8" fir plywood. Well, it was the best of times & the worst of times, because those businessmen showed us how generous & community spirited good companies can be. They agreed to supply us with the better plywood at no cost. Hats off to Murray Wilson, Gibsons Building Supply, Ed Wood, AFA Forest Products, & Doug Rogers, CANUSA Forest Products, whose generosity went a long way towards making this situation right again.

Now began the backbreaking work of tearing up the inadequate floor. This took Tony Stroud & his team of volunteers, many of whom had installed it in the first place, 5 more days of hard work. Thank you to Ron Atkinson, David Marsh, Serge Planidin, Peter Kosof, Charlie Jensen, Bert Carswell, Leroy Pattison, & all the others who pitched in! Special thanks to Tony Stroud, who coordinated the effort, & to Linda Stroud, who made sure all were well fed. By Friday afternoon they were done, the new plywood had arrived, & the flooring company started work on Sunday.

Bravo Floors also stepped up to the plate, working long hours to ensure we're ready to reopen as soon as possible. I can testify that walking on the cushioned sports floor is divine – pickleballers, dancers, carpet bowlers, exercisers, yoga goers & all users will have an enhanced experience, & I hope you will all agree it was worth the effort in the end!

Apologies to those members who lost out on activities, especially to Sandra Sharkey, who had to scramble to find another venue for your very special event. Thank you for being so gracious about it all, & Congratulations to the Newlyweds!

SSAC has many exciting events this fall, including the fundraisers, Mystery Dinner Theatre – Sept. 23rd & "Coats of Paint" Nov. 4th, &, of course, the annual Open House on Oct. 7st.

Finlay, "Fin" Anthony passed away in July in the local hospital. Predeceased

by his wife Audrey, and survived by two sons, one daughter and 5 grandchildren. He was 87. Fin spent many years in radio and was a prominent publicist. He was well-known for his Woodward's Department Store and Food Floor ads and Premier Bill Bennett was amongst his many clients.

He was very active fisherman, creating the world's first and largest Salmon Derby in 1958, hosting a tv show "Fishing with Fin" and was President of Save Our Salmon Society, Save the Fish Foundation, and the Pacific Salmon Society, striving to protect the oceans and streams. A Celebration of Life will take place this fall when the salmon have returned to our rivers and cutthroats are back at our beaches.

He was very active in Bridge and Poker groups at the Centre. Fin was an enthusiastic watch dog on the Sechelt Council. He was an excellent political satirist and created many smiles with his frequent emails. He is missed!
