To qualify, your annual taxable income cannot exceed \$30,000 for individual or \$40,000 for family and you must provide all of your T-slips. This service IS NOT for those who have business returns, rental returns or complicated investments. For this tax service you must make an appointment. Please leave your name and phone number with the receptionist at the information desk.

With the record breaking demand for lunches and take-home entrees, and a shortage of volunteers, existing workers have risen to the occasion, often working two and three shifts a week. We have new recruits in the pipe-line, so hopefully the work overload will ease in the next short while.

Your new Board is also hard at work. The Centre's work is supported through the efforts of several committees, consisting of Board members and other volunteers. These committees manage activities such as the bus trips, pickleball, bridge, crafts and poker to name only a few, coordinate membership and volunteer recruitment, oversee the kitchen, maintenance, and technical services, and much more. These various committees will describe their work in future Echo editions. Perhaps you will be inspired to volunteer on a committee.

Another new event planned is a monthly Orientation Session for new volunteers. The aim is to be more efficient at contacting those who want to volunteer, help them feel connected to the Centre, and give them an opportunity to give us feedback. I'm thinking regular sessions like this for existing volunteers may also be a good idea. I would like to hear your feedback about this idea.

Finally, a huge vote of thanks is due to LeRoy Pattison, for his work in publishing the ECHO for the past several years. Kassie Ranchie will now take over this function, with the oversight of the Board. LeRoy will continue to volunteer in the kitchen and on the Membership Committee, and he has graciously agreed to provide backup services for the Echo when Kassie is away.





Pecan Shortbread Bars

You'll love the simplicity of these fiveingredient wonders. For best results, be sure to use good, high-quality butter.

Ingredients

2 sticks (1 cup) unsalted butter, at room temperature

3/4 cup confectioners' sugar

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

2 cups all-purpose flour

1 cup toasted chopped pecans

1/2 teaspoon flaky salt (optional)

Directions

- 1. Line an 8 x 8-inch square pan with parchment paper, leaving extra overhang.
- 2. Using an electric mixer, cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add the vanilla and mix again.
- 3. Gradually add the flour and mix until well combined. Fold in the toasted nuts. Press the dough into an even layer on the bottom of the prepared pan, making sure to fill the corners. Score the dough to make 24 bars (4 rows by 6 rows). Using a chopstick or fork, make dimples into the pieces. Refrigerate for at least 30 minutes.
- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 5. Remove the pan from the refrigerator. Sprinkle with salt, if desired. Bake in the oven until golden on the edges, 55 to 60 minutes.
- 6. Remove from the oven and let cool for 10 minutes. Remove the cookies from the pan by grasping the parchment paper. While still warm, cut the cookies along the scored lines. Let cool on a rack.

Tip: To toast nuts, spread them out in a single layer on a rimmed baking sheet and place in a 325 degrees F oven until they are light brown and smell toasted, 5 to 15 minutes. Watch them closely, as they can quickly burn.
