Once again the taxman cometh and people are scrambling to put together their receipts. And once more, we are being graced by the presence of Louis Legal and his team of volunteers to help with income tax preparation.

This year the team will be here 2 days a week through March and April. Beginning March 1st, the Community Volunteer tax Preparation Program will set up shop in the Dr. Farish Room on Tuesdays and Wednesdays between 10:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Volunteers will complete tax returns, free of charge, for low-income Individuals earning less than \$30,000 and families earning less than \$40,000 in 2014. The program does not serve clients with self-employment income, rental property income or capital gains. Interest income must be less than \$1000.

# SSAC To Apply for Sponsorship



More than four million Syrians have registered or are awaiting registration with the UN High Commission of Refugees. According to UNICEF 51% of the refugees are children.

There was an excellent turnout at the Special Membership Meeting on January 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss the proposal to sponsor a Syrian Refugee family. The meeting started with a PowerPoint presentation which provided information about the process and requirements for applying to be a sponsor.

In order to be approved as a sponsor, an organization must make a financial guarantee for the immigrants' settlement and living for the first year. The Board proposal was to sponsor a family of four, which required a guarantee of \$36,000. While the Activity Centre acts as a guarantor, President Joanne Rykers explained that fundraising will offset at least 50% of that obligation.

The committee that has been exploring the feasibility of sponsorship has already had an offer of free rent in a furnished home for the first year.



Barbara Cochrane, who has been part of the group sponsoring Tibetan refugees, spoke about that group's experience. They have offered their assistance to the SSAC in sorting through government forms, bureaucracy and just offering their experience to avoid problems which might arise.


After the presentation, various members took turns expressing their opinions both for and against the proposal.

The meeting concluded with a show-ofhands vote where over 75% of those in attendance were in favour of the proposal.

"I'm very happy with the results," stated Joanne Rykers. "Now the work begins. There's a lot to do to put together the application and prepare for approval." Anyone who would be interested in offering their assistance can contact Joanne at the Centre office Tuesday through Thursday.

# **Bus Travels With Rick**

For February, the bus committee has two trips planned. The first trip will be on February 25<sup>th</sup> which will be going to the Vancouver Planetarium (H.R. MacMillan Space Centre). The bus will leave the Centre @ 9:15 A.M. to catch the 10:20 ferry. After arriving at Horseshoe Bay, we will drive to the West Van Seniors' Centre for lunch.

Make sure you bring your Sechelt Centre's membership card as you can get a discount on the price of your lunch. After lunch we will proceed to the Planetarium for two shows. One show is in the main theatre and it takes you on a journey through our Solar System and beyond into the Universe. The other show is called the Colour of Fire and it deals with stars and what they are composed of. There are also displays to view in the Cosmic Courtyard.

On our way back to the 5:30 ferry, we will stop at Park Royal. There people can browse a couple of stores or have a coffee or tea. The cost of this trip is \$47.00 for seniors and \$53.00 for those under 65 years. This price includes the cost of admission into the Planetarium. If interested, please sign up early. The second trip planned will be on Sunday, February 28<sup>th</sup> and it will be going to Cloverdale Racetrack (Fraser Downs) and the new Elements Casino. The bus will leave the Centre at 7:40 A.M. and will be returning on the 5:30 P.M. ferry. The cost per person is \$45.00.

Last year the cost was \$65.00 per person. However it did include the cost of a buffet lunch. This year we are not including the cost of the buffet lunch and people can choose where they would like to have lunch. There are a few dining options there.

One of these is the Diamond Buffet which offer seniors a 25% discount. Another buffet overlooks the racetrack but does not offer a discount. Come out and enjoy a day of live horse racing and try your luck in the casino.

The bus committee is planning a 2night/3day trip to Harrison Hot Springs tentatively scheduled for April 19 – 21, 2016. The price will be announced during the first week of February. An interest sign up sheet will be at the front desk.
