


### Funtastics Return for Their Sixth Annual Show



The Chair Actors lost a valuable and talented friend when the curtain came down on the life of Sandy Hook resident Martin Evans on July 27. He had been fighting leukemia for about seven years.

His 35-year acting career had taken him to all the major regional theatres in the country. He was a founding member of the original Bard on the Beach festival in Vancouver, and also appeared in numerous TV series and films. He worked with, and learned from, some really well known screen actors including lan Richardson. He could name drop like crazy.

Trained as an architect in the UK, Martin had always had a passion for acting. What he lacked in theatre training, he picked up quickly in courses and workshops. In Vancouver in the mid-1980s, he and I were often cast together in lightweight "Britcoms." The most fun we ever had was in a dreadful farce called Sextet at Stage West in Calgary in 1989, "starring" ex-Playboy bunny Barbi Benton. With actor Bernard Cuffling, we then took Faith Healer, a brilliant drama by the Irish playwright Brian Friel, to the Vancouver Fringe Festival, then the Arts Club, and even to the wilds of Sechelt — the first live-stage production at the brand-new Raven's Cry Theatre. Neither Martin nor I ever thought we'd end up as neighbours in such a remote place!

For the Chair Actors, he directed *My Father's Story* in 2013, *Restless Spirits* in 2014, and *Ghost Stories* in November 2015. He fainted on stage in the last few pages of *A Christmas Carol*, in which he portrayed Dickens reading all the characters' voices, but insisted on finishing the piece. He did manage to design our Art Deco set for *Blithe Spirit* last April.

Now he's a spirit, and I hope he's a blithe one.
