Attendance was steady during the peak hours, and most people were quite pleased with their bargains, according to "exit polls" conducted by Kit Artus.

The SSAC Craft group netted over \$800, while the Refugee group did \$600 worth of business, and sixteen of 30 tables were sold to community vendors, at the very reasonable price of \$15/per table.



Exciting news from Salt Seas

Charlie the clownfish has a friend! Today we

introduce Ecsenius stigmatura, the Tailspot Blenny.

This Blenny lives amongst the rocks, where it can be seen peeking its head out of small holes, or



laying around, keeping watch over the aquarium and the people looking in. You may also notice that it bites at the rocks. This Blenny is an omnivore, and it uses its rasp-like teeth to scrape the algal film off the surface, and happily eats any small crustaceans it encounters as well.

The Blenny will defend its territory from snails, who also graze on algae.

You may notice that this fish is capable of changing colours! It's normally blue-ish and orange body can quite quickly develop white stripes, and it's lips will show white patches that look like fearsome tusks. This helps the Blenny to become camouflaged in its environment.

While the Blenny can swim, it spends much of its time laying on the rocks. This is because, unlike most fish, the Blenny does not have a swim bladder: an organ which holds a small amount of air, and keeps a fish buoyant. It can, however, easily swim backwards, even reversing vertically into holes. Being a bottom dweller, the Blenny occupies a different ecological niche in the aquarium than the clownfish and reduces the chance of aggression between the fish because they don't compete for the same food.

In other news, our chef Emily was recently interviewed in a podcast about keeping salt water aquariums.
