Presidents Message December 2016



As I write this, another year comes to a close, and 2017 looms at the doorstep. The past year has been a busy and fruitful year at the SSAC.

I am thankful to be working with my Board of Directors, who are overworked, definitely underpaid and sometimes unappreciated. I am also grateful for the dedication of hundreds of volunteers, for the hard work performed by our three contractors, and for the support of the membership.

The New Year will bring its own challenges, as we move forward to implement projects that have been in the planning stage. Pending Board approval, in February at the AGM, you will be asked to vote on a resolution that gives the Board permission to move ahead on the building renovation plan.

It is crucial that you all attend, as this vote will require approval from 2/3 of the membership present. The resolution will ask that you approve the expenditure of funds to begin the process of building renovation. The Planning Committee came to this proposal after much study, and I commend the members on their year of hard work.

The status quo is not an option. We are the victim of our own success and more space is necessary if we are to continue to serve the needs of the membership.

An information booklet will be distributed in January, outlining the renovation plan, and the proposed funding sources.

The plan calls for a modest expansion to the front of the building, which will result in improved kitchen and dining capability, increased access to the auditorium for activities, and some much needed office space.

Please familiarize yourselves with the proposal, and plan to attend the AGM, Thursday, February 16, at 1:30 pm.

On Thursday, January 19, at 11:00 – 1:00 pm, our MP, Pam Goldsmith-Jones will be touring the Centre. She will be viewing activities, meeting people, having lunch and meeting with the Planning Committee to discuss federal funding for the building renovation.

An exciting new fundraising project is also planned. Please read about "The Treasure Chest" in this edition. This project has been wildly successful in two Maritime communities. As always, we need volunteers to help, and, if you like counting money, this is the job for you!

Once again, it is Annual Report time. The Society is obligated to present a yearly report of its activities to the membership at the AGM in February, and then to file this report with the B.C. Registry of Societies. If you are the chair of a committee, or an activity, you will be asked to contribute a short summary of your work to the Board Secretary.

In closing, I wish you all a Happy New Year! I hope that 2017 brings good news to you and yours, and perhaps to the world at large.

Sechelt Seniors Treasure Chest

The Treasure Chest is a novel fundraising project that we hope will be an exciting way to raise funds for our proposed building renovation. It allows all participants to contribute to the improvement of our Centre.

Country Stars Fold After 45 Years

The Sunshine Coast Country Stars square and round dancers held their final gathering Dec. 7, 2016 after 45 years at the Sechelt Seniors Activity Centre.

The Country Stars have a huge history on the Coast and particularly with the Seniors Activity Centre. In 1971 the Sechelt Promenaders and the Gibsons Squarenaders amalgamated to form the Sunshine Coast Country Stars Square & Round Dance Club.

The Country Stars danced at various locations around the coast up to the time of the move to the hall on Mermaid St. in 1985 In 1992 with the opening of the "Big Hall" on Trail Ave. where we have danced every Wednesday night for the last 24 years.

A special arrangement was agreed upon by the Senior's Branch #69 (now Sechelt Seniors Activity Centre) and was included in SSAC's Constitution allowing the Country Stars to function as a Club within the SSAC Society thus increasing the membership of SSAC substantially. This increase in membership assisted the SSAC to qualify for the necessary funding to go ahead with the building of the "New Hall".

During the time of the building of the "new hall", many of the Square Dancers volunteered working, painting, laying the floor and landscaping etc.

We have had many special dances, including visiting clubs over the years filling the hall with joyful sounds. Unfortunately, as time progressed, the numbers reduced to a point that it was difficult to have a full square of dancers.



A sad, but necessary decision was made by the remaining members to discontinue the square and round dancing activity. It is with so many fond memories of our "Friendship Set to Music" that we say "Happy Trails" and keep in touch.
