The AGM for February 2017 had an impressive turnout of 104 members, indicating that the Special Resolution on the proposed renovations project was important to many. A very informative presentation by Peter Treuheit, consultant, was well received, and provoked a good discussion with many questions and positive suggestions.

The resolution passed easily, with 94 votes in favor, and 5 against. This allows the process of detailed planning to begin.

Our next step is to apply to the District of Sechelt for a Variance on parking requirements. If all goes well, construction can begin in early 2018, but there will be lots of opportunity for ongoing input and discussion.

The AGM continued with Executive Reports, and the message to the membership was that the SSAC is very healthy, both financially and in membership activity and involvement.

The election of new officers for 2017 proceeded smoothly. The new Board includes Joanne Rykers, President, Barbara Lightfoot, Past-President, Charlie Jensen, Vice-President, Donna Marsh, Treasurer, Gwen Austen, Secretary, Tony Stroud, Maintenance Director, and 4 Directors-at-Large; Ron Atkinson, Margaret Boyd, Dorothy Fraser, Kit Moffat.
