President's Message

December is here, and the Centre is looking very festive, thanks to the excellent work of the decorating divas. We began to get into the Christmas spirit at our Craft Fair on November 18th. The auditorium was filled with good cheer, as busy vendors provided a variety of wares to enthusiastic shoppers. An enjoyable and profitable time was had by all.

The SSAC Christmas lunch is on December 15th, and this is the start of the Christmas break for the Centre. Tickets are \$20 each, and go on sale December 1st. Members can bring one guest. As well as Emily's delicious turkey dinner, there will be door prizes, and some very special entertainment. The kitchen will be closed on December 14th, to give Emily and her volunteers time to prepare, so the last kitchen meal for 2017 will be served on Wednesday, the 13th.

I regret to say that there will not be a New Year's Eve Lunch this year. The Centre is rented on Sunday mornings to the Church of Latter Day Saints, a longstanding contract that we are obliged to honor. Other days and other venues were considered, but none were workable. I am sorry because many enjoy this tradition. The Centre is open again on Tuesday, January 2nd, and I look forward to seeing everyone then.

This Christmas, I am very much aware of what it means to have a home, and how it must feel not to have one. I think of our sponsored refugee family, the upheavals they have had, fleeing from their home in war

-torn Syria, living in limbo for several years, and now relocating to Canada, but bringing with them heavy memories of the home and the life they had before. I think also of the difficult housing situation here in Sechelt, with low availability and prices unaffordable for many, leaving some vulnerable to being homeless. Having a home represents security and belonging, two fundamental human needs. In our Constitution, we hold the safety and dignity of the person to be a basic right, and certainly having a home speaks to this right. So, this Christmas, I take my hat off to those who are helping others in need, whether it is by giving refugees a home, helping to house people here at home or in war torn countries, and to all of you who care. Merry Christmas, and thank you for understanding.




